

Muncy Borough
Council Minutes
June 3, 2025

The meeting of the Muncy Borough Council was called to order in the Library/Media Center of the Muncy High School at 6:30pm by President Scott Delany followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and by a moment of silence for Armed Forces, First Responders and Front-Line workers.

Council Members present: Tara Ashby, Thad Martin, Ryan Scruggs, Scott Delany, George Henry and Richard Sutton. Bill Scott was absent.

Staff Present: Secretary/Treasurer Katie Hakes. Borough Manager, Charley Hall was on the phone while Mayor Jon Ort was absent.

Guest Present: Wayne Wolfgang, Donna Sutton, Chip Gottschall, Cindy Appleman, Marco Colbert, Craig Scruggs, Cathy Henry and Linda Stein.

Public Participation: None

Tara Ashby made a motion to approve the May 6, 2025 minutes. Thad Martin 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Richard Sutton made a motion to approve the check disbursements and bank balances. George Henry 2nd the motion. All were in favor.

Old Business: Borough building – No update at this time.

New Business:

Thad Martin made a motion to approve Crossroads Corner Park bid award for Big Rock. George Henry 2nd the motion. Motion carried 4-2 with Richard Sutton and Tara Ashby voting No. Linda Stein, a former council member who was involved in the design for Crossroads Park, thinks the design needs to be simplified. The sight prep for the trees to grow alone will be costly and she feels the plaza should be eliminated completely because she doesn't feel it will be a place for people to gather.

Richard Sutton made a motion to approve the River Valley Transit Authority Match Requirement Resolution 2025-08. Tara Ashby 2nd the motion. Motion carried.

George Henry made a motion to approve the Muncy Pool Donation request. Thad Martin 2nd the motion. Motion carried. The borough will be donating \$3500 to the Muncy Pool.

Richard Sutton made a motion to appoint Greg Delany, Ed Feigles and Tim King to the Appeals Board. Ryan Scruggs 2nd the motion. Motion carried.

Manager Report: Charley submitted the application for the Congressional Direct Spending Appropriations for the Federal Government. The LSA grant will not be announced until

September at the earliest. All of the Boroughs information was received. Chipper days will be coming in the near future. Fourth Friday was a little chilly and rainy. There were no issues that the Borough was made aware of from DMI.

Police Report: Richard Sutton made a comment that one officer wrote 59 citations. The majority of those citations were a result from the license plate readers that the department received from the Grant. That Grant was very well worth it.

Councilman George Henry spoke about the privilege he had to participate in the Arbor Day festivities that took place on April 29th at Meyers Elementary. 
